The Red Zone

The first six weeks of college— the highest risk of sexual victimization for first-year students. The time period from the start of fall classes to the beginning of Thanksgiving break

Student Conduct Definitions

Domestic Violence: is as a pattern of abusive behavior in any relationship that is used by one partner to gain or maintain power and control over another intimate partner. Domestic violence can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic, or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person.

Stalking: a pattern of repeated and unwanted attention, harassment, contact, or any other course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to feel fear.

Attempted or completed sexual assault: includes (but is not limited to) sexual penetration oral sex, genital contact, and/or touching of a sexual nature that is perpetrated against the will of the victim by a person or persons known or unknown to the victim. This includes engaging in sexual behavior with a person who is unable to consent.

What to do if someone tells you they've experienced sexual, domestic/relationship violence

Believe them. Victims of violence need to know that their support system believes them.

Listen to them. Some people will talk about their experiences and some will not. Be sure not to share information without permission.

Validate their feelings.

Acknowledge any emotion they show and let them know that their feelings are normal. Assure them that they are not alone.

Support their healing process.

Healing takes time. Assure them that this experience will cause some disruption in their life, but they can heal. Encourage them to seek help from campus and/or community services.



Consent

Sexual activity requires consent, which is defined as positive, unambiguous, and voluntary agreement to engage in specific sexual activity throughout a sexual encounter.



Consent cannot be inferred from the absence of a “no.” A clear “yes,” verbal or otherwise, is necessary.

Consent to some sexual acts does not imply consent to others, nor does past consent to a given act imply present or future consent.

Consent must be ongoing throughout a sexual encounter and can be revoked at any time.

Consent cannot be obtained by threat, coercion, or force.

Consent cannot be obtained from someone who is asleep or otherwise mentally or physically incapacitated, whether due to alcohol, drugs, or some other condition. A person is mentally or physically incapacitated when that person lacks the ability to make or act on decisions to engage in sexual activity. Consent cannot be obtained from a person whom you know, or reasonably should know, to be incapacitated.

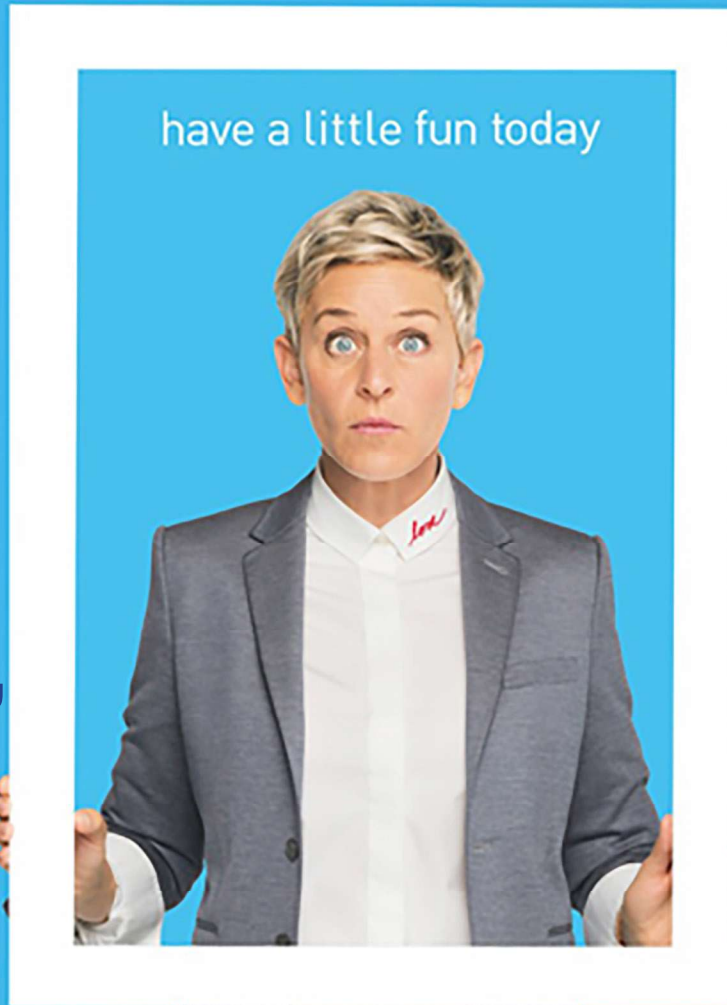

Tessa Virtue, Scott Moir talk future

London, Ont. ice dancing darlings Tessa Virtue and Scott Moir got a very warm welcome Tuesday morning on The Ellen DeGeneres Show.

The pair appeared on the program to talk about their two Olympic gold medals from last month's games in PyeongChang, even bringing their hardware with them.

"Your fans campaigned to get you on the show, it was trending on Twitter, it was a huge deal," DeGeneres said.

Virtue noted that social media is new for them so they are very appreciative of the response

they've received.

"In Vancouver and in Sochi, at both those Olympics, neither of us were active on social media and we're fiercely private. This has been really special to share our Olympic experience with so many people and this is such a thrill and an honor. So thank you to everyone for getting us here!"

DeGeneres asked if it's sunk in for them that they are now the most decorated figure skaters in history.

"Obviously, a lot of things have to go right to have three different cycles, especially as a team," said Moir. "It's been pretty special."

DeGeneres remarked on the obvious chemistry between the two, asking them if they're a couple which Virtue denied before adding that they take it as a compliment that people are so invested in the emotion they portray on the ice.

"If we were, we would announce it here," Virtue joked.

When asked if the Pyeongchang Olympics would be their final games, the two said it likely would be their last.

DeGeneres also played a game with the two dubbed 'The Definitely Not Dating Game', where Virtue and Moir were asked to answer questions about themselves before the show and then asked to guess each other's answers.

The two ended up getting almost every question right.

Portia de Rossi gives Ellen DeGeneres a gorilla sanctuary

Portia de Rossi is giving wife Ellen DeGeneres her own namesake gorilla conservation centre for her 60th birthday.

De Rossi announced the gift during an episode of The Ellen DeGeneres Show on Jan.31.

Her donation to the Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund will create a permanent home in Rwanda for the organization that has been protecting endangered mountain gorillas for 50 years.

DeGeneres said in a statement Thursday that she is “beyond excited” about the opportunity to work with the group. She said de Rossi “knew the exact right gift to give me.”

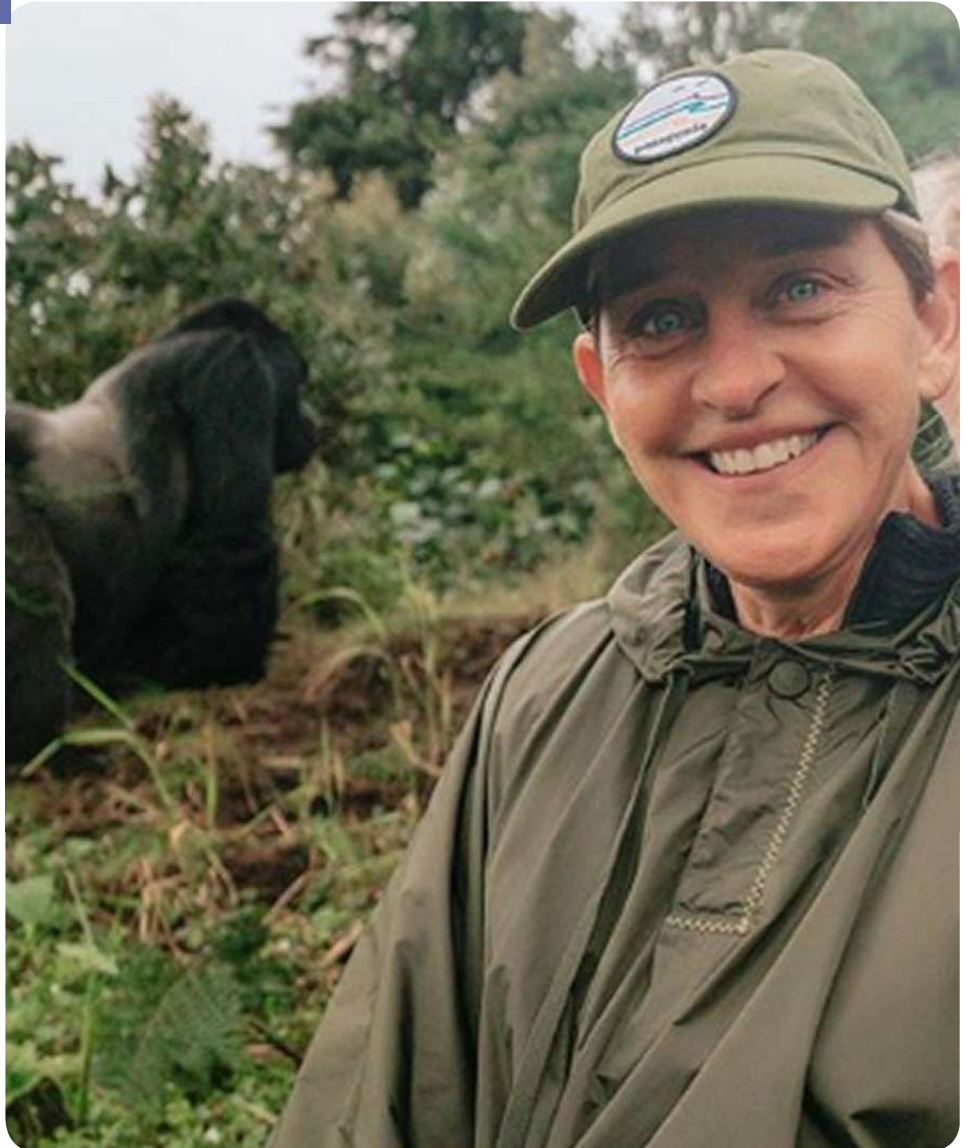
DeGeneres has been an animal-rights activist for many years. People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals named her “woman of the year” in 2009.

Fossey wrote *Gorillas in the Mist*. She died in 1985.

DeGeneres’ actual birthday is on Jan. 26.

Portia de Rossi is currently in Rwanda with The Ellen Fund – The Ellen DeGeneres Wildlife Fund – for a ceremonial groundbreaking of the Ellen DeGeneres Campus of the Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund.

“I’m in the north of the country on the edge of Volcano National Park and it’s stunningly beautiful here,” says Portia. Tonight I will fall asleep knowing that, in the national park just down the road, there are magnificent mountain gorillas also sleeping – the last of them in existence. And in the morning we will all celebrate the groundbreaking for the Campus that can help them

live on. Ellen and I are so excited!”

In 2018, Portia de Rossi gifted her animal-loving wife Ellen DeGeneres with the surprise of a lifetime: Ellen’s very own wildlife fund to provide support to organizations working on behalf of wildlife conservation.

The Ellen DeGeneres Campus of the Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund – which will house Karisoke and all

of its programs – will be a global example of socially and environmentally responsible design. It will be a place that will accelerate real and sustainable outcomes for an endangered species and the communities who reside near them. That is why the mission of the campus is to make gorillas an entry point for a lifetime of conservation activism.
